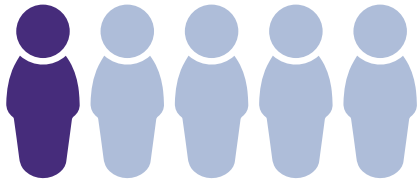


Spotlight on continence in the UK
