

One of The Urology Foundation's central tenets is that we are not only improving urology treatment and care through funding, but also investing in the development of urologists and training the next generation of leaders in the field.

Successful TUF Fulbright scholars are required to supply TUF with a satisfactory report at the end of their award and are encouraged to submit abstracts of their work to the British Association of Urological Surgeons (BAUS) Annual Meeting.

Reporting is essential for TUF to demonstrate the impact we have and the progress that is being made in the fight against urology disease. The lay public can be persuaded to support TUF with insightful reports that easily and clearly demonstrate the impact that TUF and its researchers are having. The use of lay language is therefore crucial as it allows these reports to serve as an informative link between TUF's supporters and TUF's researchers.

Any future reference to this award should acknowledge funding from TUF and the award should be listed on your CV.

Reporting Requirements

Upon completion of the project the scholars must submit a final report (maximum four sides of A4) for review by TUF's Scientific and Education Committee and the Board of Trustees of The Urology Foundation. The report should be completed in lay terms.

Below is a guide that we request our Fulbright Scholars follow when submitting their written reports.

- Title of project
- Name & position of author and place of work in UK
- Name of supervisor, department and institution visited
- Date of report
- Project starting date and completion date
- Research hypothesis
- Research methodology
- Research findings
- Significance of findings - what is the impact for further research?
- Significance of findings - what is the potential future clinical impact? This can be speculative and with a long term view.
- Any skills, techniques, practices or other benefits that were derived from the trip that will be brought back to the UK
- Your future studies and plans
- Please include photographs from your trip

NB: Please ensure that your report is written in layman's language with no technical terms or jargon. The report will need to make sense to someone with no scientific background or prior understanding of the research project.
